IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- **1.**) The Traveling Again Reclamation Program (TARP) has been extended until further notice.
- **2.)** To enter the Alabama School of Masonry (masonic college) on our website, you must enter the password
- **3.**) The souvenir journal information for 2023 has been disseminated and is also available on the website. Please pay strict attention to the deadline date of May 15th. Please do not wait until the deadline approaches to submit your ads. Begin submitting your ads now. **All subordinate Lodges are <u>REQUIRED</u> to purchase or sell a full-page ad or two half page ads. All Grand Lodge Officers and**

Grand District Deputies are <u>REQUIRED</u> to purchase a full-page ad. Let us make this year's souvenir journal the best ever.

- **4.**) Addresses and telephone numbers on lodge rolls must be updated at least once a year and as often as needed as members often relocate.
- **5.**) When filing a death claim, be sure to mail in the **original death certificate** along with the Endowment/Burial Claim. Please notate if the family wishes to have the original copy of the death certificate returned to them and we will return it after review.
- **6.)** Brothers who reinstate and demit must always reinstate to the lodge that they were members of when suspended and then demit to the lodge of their choice. If a brother's lodge no longer exists, he is to be referred to his Grand District Deputy to help in completing the paperwork to get him on another lodge's roll.
- 7.) Brothers who reach exemption status are exempt from endowment dues only. To be approved for exemption status, a brother must have been a member of the Endowment Department at least thirty-two (32) years without a break in time (i.e., suspension for non-payment of dues, suspension from the lodge, etc.). When requesting exemption status on a brother, please complete an Endowment Dues Exemption Application and mail it to the office. If the brother qualifies, you will receive a letter stating that he has been approved. If the brother does not qualify, you will receive a letter stating when he is eligible.
- **8.**) When you renew your license plates, please remember to purchase a Prince Hall Grand Lodge license plate. A donation of \$41.25 of the \$50.00 fee will go to the Prince Hall Legacy Foundation for scholarship purposes. We should be proud to show the world that we are Prince Hall Masons.
- **9.**) Any current or reinstating member who would like to receive a membership certificate may send a check or money order in the amount of \$5.00 to the Grand Lodge Office along with a note requesting a certificate.
- 10.) A Request for Dispensation should be made as early as possible and must be made no fewer than fourteen (14) days prior to the event, emergency circumstances excepted. Requests must be made to the Most Worshipful Grand Master.

- 11.) The current fee structure is as follows:

 - b.) New Membership (includes membership certificate) \$30.00
 - c.) Membership Certificates \$5.00
 - d.) Taxes \$25.00
 - e.) Registration \$25.00

 - h.) Membership Card Sticker 25C
 - i.) Book of Constitutions \$20.00
 - j.) Assessment New Members and those suspended before June 2002 \$200.00. Those suspended after June 2002 \$250.00 (all have two years to pay)
